## Joanne Gwatkin-Williams shares a story about her Austin Healey Sprite

**Vehicle:** 1961 Austin Healey Sprite MkII Engine Capacity 948cc Full restoration circa 1986

Additional Information: Ashley were builders of fibreglass bodies for a variety of Specials in the 1960s, but broadened their work to include hard tops and bonnets for the Midgets and Sprites. This Ashley bonnet was designed originally for the Mark I Sprite, not Mark II.



#### Ashley and Me - A Tale of Fun and Frustration

I thought it might be entertaining to share with members a tale from my long association with the car I call – rather un-originally – 'Ashley'. 'Un-originally' because he is in fact an 'Ashley' Sprite. I bought him in November (1989), so tried the name 'Poppy', (Poppy day in the UK is in November), for a while but, no, he is definitely a little boy, not a little girl, so 'Ashley' he has remained.

In the 1980s, I lived in the rather less than 'posh' area of Tooting Broadway, London, (think 'The Bill'), but worked at the Design Council in Piccadilly Circus, a 28 km round trip that I cycled every day.

I had the good fortune to be one of those people that ran the British Design Awards and even more good fortune, I ran the Motor Panel. Our judges, (name drop warning), were Spen King (TVR, Land Rover), Keith Duckworth, (Cosworth Engines), Peter Stevens (Lotus car designer), Mike Kimberley (Lotus CEO), Gerald Broadbent, (Tautliner) and a couple of journalists.

When Gerald came in one day and announced that he had bought a Healey 3000 it set me thinking ... why don't I have a proper car? Aside from the fact that I lived in a 'dodgy' part of London and had no garage, that is. He advised I look for a Midget or a Sprite and on one of my many bike rides, I found a Sprite for sale on the streets of Battersea. A Mr Talbot-Williams, (Yes...another hyphenated-Williams!), was the owner and on 3 November 1989, I bought my Sprite and drove it all the way home to my mum's house in Sussex.

#### And so... the adventure begins

The first one being that the vibration from the road surface on the dual carriageway travelling South was sufficient to shake off all the bolts that were securing the roof!! I spent most of the trip with one hand on the steering wheel and the other grimly clinging to the rim of the fibreglass top. I should have known the perils of buying an old car as I had once been sitting on the parcel rack of a friend's MG when the battery – housed underneath my bum – caught fire!! Have you ever tried getting out of the back of an MG in a hurry?

Many a drive was begun in fun and finished on the back of a truck, although sometimes I just bullied my way home — as I did on the occasion of a hole in the in the carburettor fuel pot float causing it to sink and fling petrol all over a hot and smoking engine. I have never had a working fuel gauge either, so it is not infrequent that I run out of fuel — I always carry a petrol can...and an extinguisher!

The day arrived when I suggested to my mother that we go on a "Youth Hostel" trip up north for a bit of holiday fun. She agreed...and she also agreed that we dispense with a roof and just take the tonneau cover and a couple of umbrellas – the theory being that as long as you are moving you won't get wet and if it is raining and you stop, (railway crossings etc), then you will stay dry under an umbrella. Good in theory. But, 'North' is invariably wet, and it certainly was this time.

We had a pleasant trip with many a stop for an empty tank and we eventually arrived in the evening at a Youth Hostel in Derbyshire and we parked beside a pub to unload our gear. But what do we see trickling out from under the car ...? Petrol. I had been over some rough roadworks earlier and must have holed the tank. So there we are, outside a pub with patrons coming out with lit cigarettes and petrol pouring out of the Ashely. Thankfully, someone found me a plastic container to collect the fuel in and I kept tossing it in to a neighbouring (uninhabited) field until the tank was empty. Next morning I rolled the car down to a garage and a bolt was bunged in to the hole and the tank sealed.

We continued our journey, as we progressed further North to Yorkshire. Next stop is another Youth Hostel, high up on a hill where we stay for a couple of nights — a chilly place...but with great views.

On the morning of our departure, before heading off to face more steep hills, I checked the engine for oil. At that moment, an enormous wind roars across the open land and rips the bonnet off the car!! I dutifully pick up the bonnet, prop it over the front of the car and gingerly crawl down the hill to a garage we had passed on our way up. Two bolts (this time) and the bonnet is re-attached ... although Ashley is beginning to look like the Munster!!

Undaunted, mum and I take off again, deeper in to Yorkshire; cold but sunny, a little rain but not too much and the landscape is glorious. Not far to our next overnight stop, when suddenly, a car just ahead of us spins on oil dropped by the many quarry lorries that use the road. The "spinning dynamo" just misses us and a dry-stone wall. "Phew!!" we say, "that was close!" Onward and upward we go and reach our furthest point where we stay a couple of nights before turning around and continue our adventure and head for home.

End of story? Oh no!!! Coming back down the road we had traversed a couple of days before, there is more oil on the roads on a damp morning and it is my turn to take a spin. I had to turn my wheel to the stone wall as the other side was a hefty drop, so "Ashley the Munster" hit the wall.

After a lovely chat with the long-suffering farmer, Ashley, mum and I were picked up by a truck and all three of us taken home – about 300 miles - to Sussex.

It took a year for Ashley to be fixed up and straightened out with much of that time spent by the garage searching for another Monza bonnet; in the end someone with the same bonnet was discovered in the Isle of Whyte and his bonnet was used to make a mould to rebuild mine.

Now do you wonder how did Ross (Australian) and I (British) meet? Well now... that is a Singapore Motor Club story!!

Also seen at the All Ford Day was this very rare 1975 Ford Capri Ghia MkII. This is one of the four such Capris that Ford imported into Australia. They were all "top of the line" Ghia models with the 3 litre V6 motor, auto transmissions and vinyl roofs. This particular Capri is painted in Ford's colour Stardust.

It has been documented that this example was the car that Ford displayed at the Melbourne Motor Show in 1975. It was pictured in the May '75 issue of Wheels magazine and they mentioned that the new model Capri might be sold locally in limited numbers for around \$7,000.

Indeed, a very rare car! Of the 4 cars imported, 2 have been found. Who knows where the other 2 cars are... perhaps sitting in barns awaiting restoration?
