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<u>Member Biography: A Valiant Life – The Story</u> <u>of the \$6 Million Dollar Builder!</u>

Dave & Kathy Chapman talk about life and their love of the Chrysler brand.



Like all of us, Dave & Kathy Chapman have faced some challenges in life, but their bond formed over the last 23 years has only strengthened.

Our story starts way back in the late 1950s, when Dave faced some health challenges at a very young age. In the ensuing years, it seemed fate had a few things in store for our intrepid Chrysler

aficionado!



At the age of just 2, Dave was suffering from pneumonia. His Dad took him to the hospital in the work panel van. Whilst his dad was inside speaking with hospital staff, the police observed the panel van parked in the Emergency area and had the vehicle towed, unaware that a very sick 2-year-old Dave was in the car! He spent 2 weeks Camperdown hospital recovering from the illness. However, the event caused quite a stir including an article in the paper!

After recovering, Dave returned home and grew up on a 6-acre

property in Plumpton, attending Plumpton Primary and Rooty Hill High, leaving school in 1972 to undertake a trade as a Carpenter & Joiner at Eric Coles Industries. After 4 years, Dave was let go. He couldn't understand it? He didn't take sickies and he did a lot of extra work, whilst the other apprentices were not as committed. The boss explained, "Dave, you're the one who I know will make it & be ok. I'm not so sure about the others." Whilst Dave was understandably



annoyed, he later understood what the boss meant.

Dave then got a job with the water board on the road gang, which he did not enjoy, but saw a chance to get a job in the carpenters' shop. He was going well and implemented improvements with his design ideas (that others took creditfor!) but they found out Dave had not finished his apprenticeship! When asked why he didn't tell them, Dave responded with the observation "well, you didn't ask!". They then employed a Polish chap who insisted that Dave be retained.

There are a few hazards as a carpenter, particularly the ability to retain all one's fingers. Fortunately, Dave avoided this risk and has all 10 digits in place, but he shared some stores where some of his work colleagues were not so fortunate. Back in 1976, Dave saw his Yugoslav work mate Joe, sustain a hand injury. Immediately Dave went to assist, using his shirt to protect the wound as Joe was taken to hospital. In 2003, Dave saw a familiar face at the local pool "hanging doors." Dave went up and asked "Is your name Joe?" and sure enough - it was the same "Joe". He showed Dave his injuries and then apologised for not returning Dave's shirt!

After 1977, Dave had completed his apprenticeship, got his builders licence and started doing contract work for a variety of home building companies. He also completed extensions and other building jobs. Eventually he was doing more extensions than sub-contracting to the project building companies. Dave continued his work in the building trade whilst also getting married. Houses he bought were renovated and improved.

Dave is a keen bird breeder, a hobby that started at the age of 7. He learnt that he could make money and this enabled him to save up money for a saddle. Dave continues to breed birds (mainly Budgies and NZ Parakeets) and has an extensive aviary at his home.





Dave has always enjoyed swimming and he swims as often as possible. When he was a teenager, he used to go all the way to Umina (from Plumpton!) to do lifesaving duties. He often competed at state level against swimmers who went on to represent Australia at

the Olympics. During the 1990s, Dave started competing in "Masters Competitions" with great success, including the "Bridge to Bridge" race on the Nepean River and achieving 2nd place at national level in swimming events.

Of course, Dave also developed a great interest in cars. His first car was an EH Holden. He purchased this car from a friend of his dad. The chap said "you give me a hand to rub it down and I'll get it resprayed". So Dave spent his weekends for a couple of months rubbing down the EH and the chap sold him the car for \$700. Dave put on some mags and fettled the engine. However, having held his licence for just 6 weeks, he had the frightening

experience of a "head-on" collision with a drunk driver, writing off his EH.

Fortunately, Dave was relatively unscathed. He purchased the wreck from the insurance company and had it repaired, but it was never the same car.

His parents had a Valiant, which Dave liked very much. Unfortunately, his mum had an accident in that car and it was a "write off" – but the seed was planted for "Chrysler Desire."

During the 90s Dave restored an FJ Holden. He was getting ready to register it, but when he got home from work, his previous wife informed him that the FJ had been sold for \$2000. Dave thought this was a joke and gave it no further thought until the next morning a chap turned up at 6am with a trailer to take the car. Interestingly, Dave never did see the money.

With his success in building, Dave was able to purchase a Pontiac Trans Am. He particularly liked the Trans Am, however, he said it was a magnet for trouble. That was finally resolved when, one night he took it to the pictures. Upon returning to the car park, the beloved Trans Am was gone...never to be seen again.



In April 2000, disaster struck! Dave was on a building site when a beam gave way. During the fall, Dave struck his head on a part of the building and suffered major head injuries, along with many other injuries. He was flown to Westmead Hospital where the medical team treated an extensive range of injuries, which included head injuries, both shoulders, vertebrae, left arm and his aorta! In total, Dave sustained about 50 fractures! In addition, a hole was drilled into his skull to reduce pressure from the head injury. Dave was in a coma for 6 weeks and in Westmead for 14 weeks. Dave says that as a result of the injuries he lost about 3 years of his life as he slowly recovered from this terrible accident.





Its was within a couple of years of this accident, Kathy met Dave. Kathy grew up in the Richmond area and left school at 15, after completing 3rd form to commence working in the retail industry in

a variety of roles including a grocery store, Franklins, fish & chips shops, a petrol station and also a boot maker in Windsor. She never went away on holidays, enjoying home and family life, staying close to her mum. She did get married, but unfortunately, this was a decision that Kathy knew was wrong for her.

In about 2002, Kathy and a friend were at the local club. In walks a "now single" Dave...with a broken arm (yet another fall — Dave was still suffering after effects from his bad accident!) He asked if he could sit down at the table and during their conversation, Dave learned that he did not live far away from Kathy.

2 days later, Kathy's son called out "Mum - There's a strange man mowing our lawn!" Kathy walked out the front door and sure enough, there was Dave..arm in sling and mowing the lawn.

Dave's commitment to Kathy was evident. When he was working on his home renovation, he was hoping Kathy would move in. The response was "Not without a nice bathroom!" Unsurprisingly, the bathroom was finished in record time...2 weeks!

In 2005, the couple tied the knot and Kathy had her first overseas holiday. The couple had their honeymoon in the USA with many

fond memories, including a visit to Paramount Pictures.

In year 2000, the Chrysler PT Cruiser was released. The car was on display at the Sydney Motor Show and caught Dave's eye. His research found that the design inspiration for the PT Cruiser was a 1937 Dodge.

In 2002, he visited a dealership in Parramatta and they invited Dave to take it for a test drive. When he explained that he lived in the outer western suburbs, they said "Take it

overnight!" So, Dave took it for a drive and fell in love with the Cruiser... "Chrysler Desire" had returned! Over the next few years, Dave joined the PT Cruiser Car Club and has had 7 (yes...seven!) PT Cruisers including a limited edition model with "flames" on the side (anyone familiar with one of Dave's Valiants now knows the inspiration for the paint scheme!). Dave & Kathy also used the PT Cruiser as their wedding cars. Kathy shares the love and was really taken by an automatic Cruiser they had for a while.



Dave appreciates the design of the PT Cruiser but also discovered some of its many practical features, including a power outlet and the back seat that could be converted into a picnic table. In addition, if the rear seat was removed it could be folded up like a suitcase and rolled on casters. How many cars have that feature?



Initially, the PT Cruiser had a 2 litre engine, but in later years an option for a 2.4 Litre became available. They also introduced a convertible, which Dave just had to have!

In 2003, Dave entered a lottery for a holiday. He got 2nd prize, which allowed them to stay at any hotel in Australia for 5 days for free! So with all the options available, Dave chose the South Coast at the Archers Resort Nowra. The "resort" was not quite what he & Kathy had expected, but it did start an interest in the NSW South Coast. So in 2003, Dave & Kathy made the move to the area, initially living in Basin View. A few acres became available in Tomerong which the couple purchased and Dave commenced building a new home on Australia Day 2014. He promised Kathy it would be finished in 6 months.

Initially Dave started on a "Shed" which became the garage, but it did include living quarters. During construction, Kathy suggested to Dave he should wait for help with some of the tasks, which he considered carefully...and subsequently ignored! Unfortunately Dave had another fall from height (the mezzanine) which saw him back in hospital. He also had a fall from a ladder that resulted in a dislocated shoulder.

However, despite Dave's misadventures, the couple moved into the main home on the 4 July 2014, just as Dave had promised Kathy. It was bitterly cold and the fireplace remained alight for many weeks.

Before leaving the Penrith Area, Dave had taken up roles in the public swimming pools in the western suburbs. His background enabled him to find jobs at both Sussex Inlet and Bomaderry. At Bomaderry, he observed that the pool was "out of level" impacting water drainage and undertook the work to get it fixed. Dave also worked with Shoalhaven Council. He was working at the Ulladulla Leisure Centre when the clock had been blown off. Dave was happy to fix it. He sought confirmation from the electrician that the power had been shut off and then commenced his work...only to have another accident with an electric shock! (It seems the site electrician was not big on detail) After sharing this, Kathy did suggest Dave was a bit "accident prone". I think she may be onto something there!

About 4 years ago, Dave got his Chrysler itch back again. His fond memories of the Valiant led him finding one for himself.

In 2021, he saw a burgundy Valiant up for auction in WA and did his bidding by phone. With a successful purchase, the cost of shipping the vehicle to Tomerong was \$2000. On delivery Dave found the seller had kindly provided a diagram for the gear shift. The seller also reported a couple of mechanical issues relating to rear wheels rubbing and clutch pedal sticking to the firewall (known to Dave at time of purchase). Dave was able to resolve these with little expense. In fact, the cause of the rear wheel rubbing was due to rear axle shackle brackets being installed upside down!

Then another Valiant attracted his attention. He saw the vehicle for sale online, but no takers. The price dropped and it still remained unsold. It then disappeared from the website. Dave presumed it was sold, but...it reappeared and so Dave made the call. After some hard negotiation, the seller agreed to Dave's price and the deal was done. When he got the vehicle, it needed some work so after spending \$14,000 buying the Valiant, another \$14,000 was spent to make it his own. It had a few modifications including bucket seats, but he decided on a special colour scheme



which evoked the memory of his PT Cruiser. Dave prepared the Valiant, but the actual respray was completed by a professional. It certainly makes the Valiant readily identifiable!

The yellow & purple Valiant is always a scene stealer and has appeared on the cover of the Valiant Car Club Magazine "The Forward Look".



Now that Dave had 2 Valiants, one might think that the "Chrysler Desire" was satisfied...but Dave really needed a "daily drive".

3 years ago, he found just the vehicle. He and Kathy travelled to Melbourne. The car that took his interest was being sold by a deceased estate. The car in question was a 2012 Chrysler 300C with just 29,000km and it was *immaculate*. Dave & Kathy did the deal and drove their new found love back to Tomerong, appreciating both the comfort and quality of the big 300C.

Whilst the couple are very fond of both the older Valiants, the 300C quickly became "The Favourite Child". Looking magnificent in black, with a 3.6Litre Pentastar V6 it was good for 218kw mated to a 8 speed auto transmission. The car really looked the part and was a car they both enjoyed immensely.

At one point, Dave had new tyres fitted to it. Later on, he went to rotate the tyres but found one wheel would not budge. Upon attending the tyre fitter, they too tried to remove the "stuck wheel" for over 2-hours...without success. Off to a specialist mechanic. 4 hours later, the hub was drilled out and it was found that when the new tyres were fitted the thread had been stripped. This was the only issue the couple had with the 300C...and it was not event the car's fault!

Our cover photo really showed what an impressive vehicle it was. Sadly, just prior to our interview for this article, disaster struck! Whilst travelling on Bolong Rd in Bomaderry, some heavy rubber matting flew off the back of a truck passing in the opposite

direction. Dave barely had time to react when the matting struck the vehicle, hitting the windscreen and damaging several panels. Whilst Kathy was safe, our "accident prone" hero was left spitting chips of windscreen, whilst he hands were covered in scratches. Another car came to assist, but the unknown truck continued, oblivious to the accident that had just occurred. Fortunately, they were travelling at just 60kph. Had this occurred at highway speed, the situation may have been much worse.



The police attended and asked Dave what the number plate of the truck was. Dave provided a laconic response noting how suddenly the incident took place. The couple were heartbroken when the vehicle was assessed as a "write off", however Dave & Kathy loved the 300C so much, they immediately started the search for a replacement and found a 2013 model that had a few more features. The burgundy colour also appealed to them both. The previous owner chose black trims, but Dave is determined to reinstate the chrome work and make the new 300C their own.



Kathy shared that, whilst she does not have a strong interest in cars, she enjoys the cars that Dave has puchased. What she really really enjoys is the comeraderie within the club and the activities the club undertakes. Dave's love of Chrysler is undiminished. He has not purchased a Chrysler Charger yet, but if the right opportunity comes along, you never know. After more than 20 years of marriage, perhaps Kathy can protect Dave from any further unfortunate accidents as they have already spent \$6 Million repairing him!








Club Event: Wheel Nuts - June 2025

Don't forget, members should also ensure the appropriate <u>Certificate of Approved Operations</u> is with the vehicle (or a copy) at all times. We have been advised that many vehicles are being checked by police and they will immediately look for this document.
